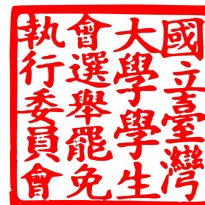

Subject: This is the notice of “The National Taiwan University 2024 Second Semester Election” including the qualifications and policies of each candidate, the time and location of voting and ballot counting, Time and Venue of the Policy Presentation Session and other reminders.

According to Article 23 of “National Taiwan University Student Association Election and Recall Act”.

1. Types of Elections

3. The Time and Location of Voting

(1) Date of Voting: Friday, May 9th, 2025.

(2) Time of Voting: From 09:30 to 16:30.

(3) Location of Voting:

- a. College of Liberal Arts: Main entrance of College of Liberal Arts Building (M5).
- b. College of Science (Excluding Department of Geography, Department of Geosciences, and Department of Atmospheric Sciences): Main entrance of Shih Liang Hall (N28).
- c. College of Social Sciences: The steel stair on the west side of College of Social Sciences Building (E11).
- d. College of Engineering, College of Medicine (Only freshman), College of Public Health(Only bachelor's Programs), Other Colleges(School of Professional Education and Continuing Studies, Center for General Education, Graduate School of Advanced Technology, NTU D-School): Main entrance of Zonghe Lecture Building (M10).
- e. College of Bio-resources & Agriculture, College of Life Science: Main entrance of Gongtong Lecture Building (M57).
- f. College of Management, Department of Geography, Department of Geosciences, Department of Atmospheric Sciences: The first floor of Building 1, College of Management (S12).
- g. College of Electrical Engineering & Computer Science: The platform on the first floor of Barry Lam Hall (E6).
- h. College of Law: Outside the moot court on the first floor of Tsai Lecture Hall (E51).
- i. College of Medicine(Excluding freshman), College of Public Health(Excluding bachelor's Programs) : In front of the Medical Library, Basic Medical Science Building (CZ12).

4. The Time and Location of Ballot Counting

(1) Date of Ballot Counting: Friday, May 9th, 2025.

(2) Time of Ballot Counting: 18:30.

- (3) Location of Ballot Counting: NTU Convenience Shop Da-Fu Branch (B1 of College of Agriculture Building, M56).
- (4) During ballot counting, all students and candidates are permitted to scrutinize balloting.
- (5) An uproar on the site of ballot counting is prohibited. The Executive Committee for Election and Recalling has the power to drive those who make a lot of noise out.
- (6) Recording and live-streaming are welcomed.

5. Time and Venue of the Policy Presentation Session:

- (1) Time: April 23, 6:30 PM
- (2) Venue: Boya Lecture Building, Room 103(subject to change; updates will be announced separately)

6. Other Reminders

- (1) Those who are currently enrolled at National Taiwan University (hereinafter referred to as “the University”) as of 2024 Second Semester are electors, and all electors are all eligible to vote. Below are some additional details:
 - a. All currently enrolled students at the University have the right of suffrage. Those who have not successfully enrolled in this semester, e.g., voluntary suspension, are not currently enrolled students, though.
 - b. Currently enrolled students include students of Undergraduate Programs, Master’s Programs, In-service Master’s Programs, Doctor’s Programs, Bachelor’s Programs of Continuing Education, International Degree Programs, and foreign exchange students.
 - c. Exchange and visiting students from the University who are currently hosted by other universities, and exchange and visiting students from other universities who are currently hosted by the University, are all eligible to vote.
- (2) This ballot is conducted by paper voting. Electors shall note that:
 - a. Electors have to claim their ballot with their own student ID card.
 - b. The photo on the front side of the student ID card must not be covered by any objects. Those holding student ID cards that fail to verify the identity of electors are not allowed to vote.
- (3) In order to proceed the election smoothly, the Executive Committee for Election and Recalling will collect and process the personal data of the electors. Relevant notice is as follows:
 - a. The personal data will only be used to conduct “National Taiwan University 2024 Second Semester Election”.
 - b. Types of personal data collected: Student ID number, name of the college, name of the department, and enrollment status.

- c. Subjects of data collection: Electors who register and claim ballot papers at the Registrar of polling stations during the voting period. (Data of those who do not register and claim ballot papers will not be collected.)
 - d. Time period and methods of using the personal data: Records of electors who claim their ballot papers such as student ID number, name of the college, name of the department, and enrollment status, will be retained for at least 6 months, in accordance with Subparagraph 3, Paragraph 1, Article 38 of “National Taiwan University Student Association Election and Recall Act”.
 - e. If individuals are not willing to have aforementioned personal data collected and processed by the Executive Committee for Election and Recalling after their arrival at the polling station, they may inform the staff of polling stations before registering and claiming their ballot paper, and stop the process of registering, claiming ballot paper, and voting.
- (4) According to Article 24 of “National Taiwan University Student Association Election and Recall Act,” Executive Committee for Election and Recalling shall publish the third notice of the election, which includes the result of this election, the voting rate, and the percentages of votes obtained of each candidate, by 7 days after the ballot-opening day.
- (5) According to Paragraph 2, Article 35 of “National Taiwan University Student Association Election and Recall Act,” the following circumstances are not allowed at the polling stations, If this happens, election officials should order the offender to leave:
- a. Making noise or disturbing or inducing others to vote or not to vote, and not obeying the persuasion.
 - b. Carrying weapons or hazardous objects into the station.
 - c. Remaining in the voting booth or the station after completing the vote, and not heeding the advice.
 - d. Conducting any other misconduct and not obeying the persuasion.
 - e. Carrying phones or other photography equipment into the voting booth.
